

Boating - in Swiss German „Böötle“ - on the Limmat starts in Zurich and ends in Dietikon. Ten kilometers to cool down, have fun and experience nature. You can enter the water off Wipkingerpark or directly behind the weir Höngger Wehr (attention: keep left and get off, carry your boat around the weir). Just after Werdinsel, discover the first natural banks of the Limmat, where beavers are active (respect the near-natural shores!). You're now leaving the city. The big, round gasometer on your left marks the compound of the Schlieren gas works. The Limmat takes a left turn at the Mühlwehr dam (careful: keep left!) and on the right you will see the Fähr-

haus of the Kloster Fahr convent. You can get off and have a break at the Sommerbeiz (restaurant). Further on, after passing the Dietikon punting house, you reach the Glanzenberg fields on the left just past the big highway bridge. This landing point has access to the Glanzenberg S-Bahn station, with a lot of space, barbecue areas, bar and toilets. The last landing point across from Dietikon's train station (Nötzliwiese) is very cramped and has no infrastructure. This is the very last exit, you can't go on because of the weir.
